



Apostles vs. Disciples

Question: What is the difference between apostles and disciples?

Answer: When we look at the gospel accounts of the life of Jesus, we see two special titles applied to his followers: *apostles* and *disciples*. At first glance, we might think that these two words are interchangeable, but when we look at what each one means, we quickly see that the evangelists were using them very specifically. When we look more closely, we see that while Jesus had many *disciples*, the group of *apostles* was much more limited and referred to Jesus' closest collaborators.

The word *apostle* essentially means “one who is sent forth” or, as we might think of it today, “an ambassador.” The group of apostles — sometimes called the Twelve — included those twelve men who formed Jesus’ inner circle (see Mark 3:13-14; Luke 6:12-13). It was this group that received the gift of the Holy Spirit and who were sent out by Jesus with the special mission of forgiving sins on that first Easter Sunday (see John 20:19-23). In time, the Catholic Tradition also recognize Saint Paul and Saint Barnabas as apostles, recognizing that they also shared the mandate of going out in the Lord’s name to pray, to bless, and to preach. In 2016, during the Jubilee of Mercy, Pope Francis raised the liturgical celebration of Saint Mary Magdalene to the rank of feast, recognizing that she also received a special mandate to proclaim the good news of Jesus’ resurrection to the Eleven, becoming the “apostle to the apostles.” In a particular way, the bishops continue the mission of the apostles in our own time.

When we think of the word *disciple*, we see that it has a very different meaning. Rather than referring to those who were sent out to carry on the mission of Jesus, disciple literally means “student” or, more specially, an “apprentice learner.” The task of the disciple is to learn and integrate into their lives the teachings, values, and way of life of their master teacher. Although a disciple might be called on to explain or represent aspects of their life, in light of the teachings they receive from this master teacher, Christian discipleship is ultimately about living our lives with faith and integrity, guided by the life and mission of Jesus, our Master Teacher. The call to discipleship is the common vocation of all Christians.

Apóstoles vs Discípulos

Pregunta: ¿Cuál es la diferencia entre apóstoles y discípulos?

Respuesta: Cuando observamos los relatos del Evangelio de la vida de Jesús, vemos dos títulos especiales aplicados a sus seguidores: apóstoles y discípulos. A primera vista, podríamos pensar que estas dos palabras son intercambiables, pero cuando miramos lo que cada uno significa, rápidamente vemos que los evangelistas las estaban usando muy específicamente. Cuando miramos más de cerca, vemos que mientras Jesús tenía muchos discípulos, el grupo de apóstoles era mucho más limitado y se refirió a los colaboradores más cercanos de Jesús. La palabra apóstol significa esencialmente “el que es enviado” o, como podríamos pensar en ella hoy, “un embajador. El grupo de apóstoles —a veces llamados los Doce— incluía a los doce hombres que formaban el círculo interno de Jesús (véase Marcos 3:13-14; Lucas 6:12-13). Fue este grupo el que recibió el don del Espíritu Santo y que fueron enviados por Jesús con la misión especial de perdonar los pecados en ese primer domingo de Pascua (véase Juan 20:19-23). Con el tiempo, la Tradición Católica también reconoce a San Pablo y San Bernabé como apóstoles, reconociendo que también compartieron el mandato de salir en el nombre del Señor para orar, bendecir y predicar. En 2016, durante el Jubileo de la Misericordia, el Papa Francisco elevó la celebración litúrgica de Santa María Magdalena al rango de fiesta, reconociendo que también recibió un mandato especial para proclamar la buena nueva de la resurrección de Jesús a los Once, convirtiéndose en el “apóstol a los apóstoles. De una manera particular, los obispos continúan la misión de los apóstoles en nuestro tiempo. Cuando pensamos en la palabra discípulo, vemos que tiene un significado muy diferente. En lugar de referirse a los que fueron enviados a llevar a cabo la misión de Jesús, discípulo significa literalmente “estudiante” o, más especialmente, un “aprendiz de aprendiz.” La tarea del discípulo es aprender e integrar en sus vidas las enseñanzas, valores y forma de vida de su maestro. Aunque un discípulo podría ser llamado a explicar o representar aspectos de su vida, a la luz de las enseñanzas que reciben de este maestro, el discipulado cristiano es en última instancia sobre vivir nuestras vidas con fe e integridad, guiado por la vida y la misión de Jesús, nuestro Maestro. La llamada al discipulado es la vocación común de todos los cristianos.

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
