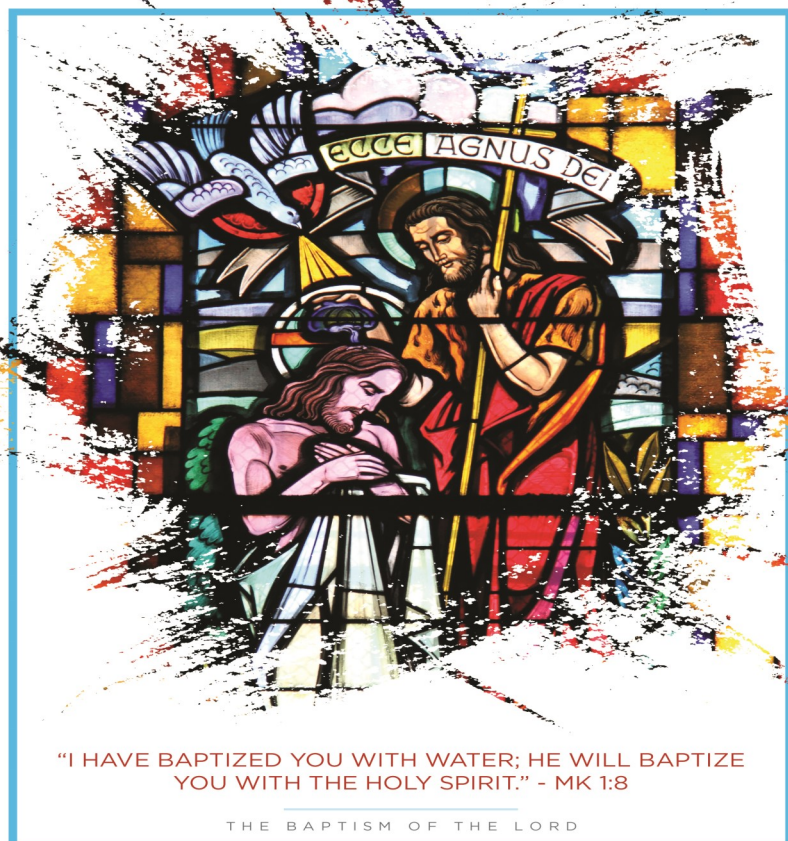
ST. GENEVIEVE'S MISSION STATEMENT

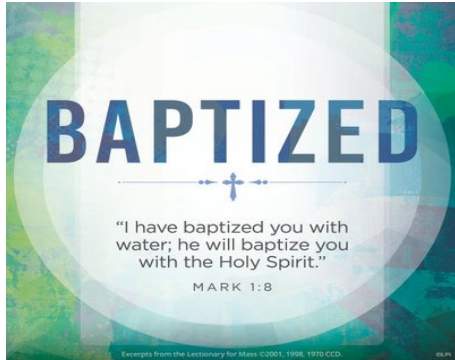

Why Hold Hands?

Question:

Why do we hold hands during the Our Father?

Answer:

The practice of members of the assembly holding hands while praying the Lord's Prayer during the Mass is a custom that developed organically in the 1970s and 1980s. While some commentators acknowledge that the practice varies from place to place, it is a fairly universal reality in parishes across the United States. For some, this action symbolizes the communion of Christians praying together as one family of believers honoring the Father of All. Critics of the practice sometimes express concern that holding hands can be a distraction from the more significant unity that is experienced when we process to the altar to receive sacramental communion.

And so, we're left to ask, what is the answer?

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (the document that offers specific instructions for the celebration of the Mass) is silent on the practice, saying only that "all the faithful say the prayer" with the priest. The website of the US Bishops simply observes that "No position is prescribed in the Roman Missal for an assembly gesture during the Lord's Prayer." And so, we're left to discern within ourselves and within our parish and religious communities what is an authentic gesture of praise during this important point of the Mass. For some, this means continuing to hold hands, while for others, this may mean adopting another posture of prayer.

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¿Por Qué Nos Atenemos de la Mano Cuando Oramos?

Pregunta:

¿Por qué nos atenemos de la mano durante el Padre Nuestro?

Respuesta:

La práctica de los miembros de la asamblea cogidos de la mano mientras rezan la oración del Señor durante la Misa es una costumbre que se desarrolló orgánicamente en las décadas de 1970 y 1980. Si bien algunos comentaristas reconocen que la práctica varía de un lugar a otro, es una realidad bastante universal en las parroquias de todo Estados Unidos. Para algunos, esta acción simboliza la comunión de los cristianos que oran juntos como una familia de creyentes en honor al Padre de Todos. Los críticos de la práctica a veces expresan preocupación de que tomar de la mano puede ser una distracción de la unidad más significativa que se experimenta cuando procesamos al altar para recibir la comunión sacramental.

Y entonces, nos queda preguntar, ¿cuál es la respuesta?

La Instrucción General del Misal Romano (el documento que ofrece instrucciones específicas para la celebración de la Misa) guarda silencio sobre la práctica, diciendo sólo que "todos los fieles dicen la oración" con el sacerdote. El sitio web de los obispos estadounidenses simplemente observa que "no se prescribe ninguna posición en el Misal romano para un gesto de asamblea durante la oración del Señor". Y así, nos queda discernir dentro de nosotros mismos y dentro de nuestras comunidades parroquiales y religiosas lo que es un auténtico gesto de alabanza durante este importante punto de la Misa. Para algunos, esto significa seguir tocándose de la mano, mientras que para otros, esto puede significar adoptar otra postura de oración.

TIPS FOR CREATING A SACRED SPACE TO REVERENTLY WATCH THE MASS

CREATE A SACRED SPACE • Set out a crucifix • Light a candle • Open your Bible to the Gospel reading • Rearrange furniture	PREPARE SPIRITUALLY • Dress the same as you would if you were attending Mass • Bless the room with holy water • Have each person bless themselves with holy water • Spend a few minutes in silence before Mass begins
ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE • Stand, kneel, and sit at the right times • Say the prayers and responses of the Mass out loud	ENGAGE IN COMMUNITY • Share a meal after Mass • Spend time talking about the Gospel reading

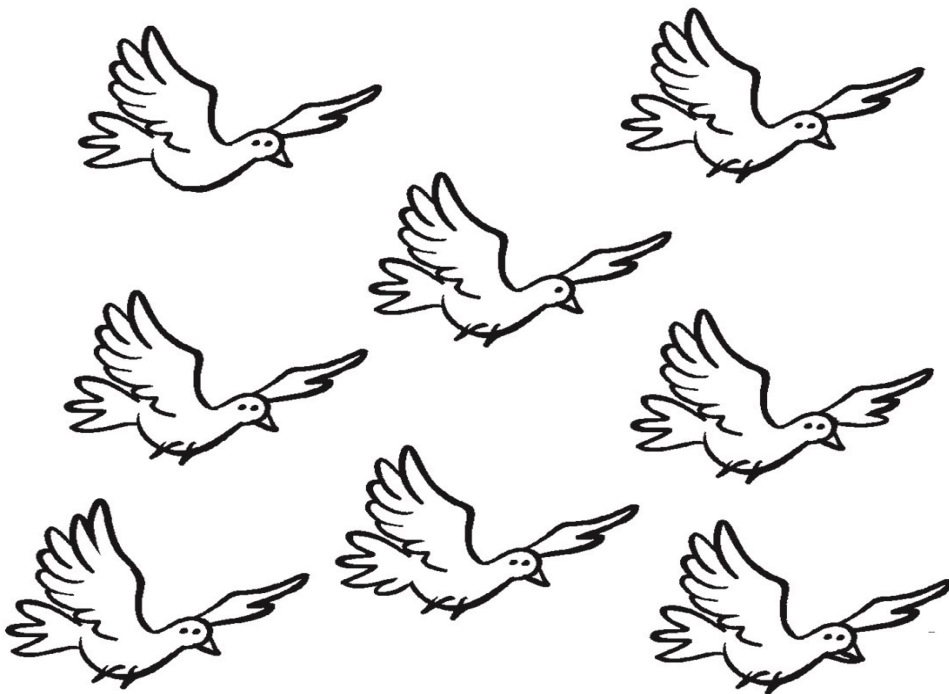
