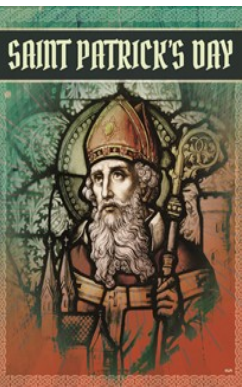

**EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN
 YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS**

Awake, O Sleeper!

This morning came a little earlier than I would have liked — Day-light Savings Time always does. Sometimes that morning sunlight seems more intrusive than illuminating. You're still half-lost in sleep, and that sun is demanding of you a lot more than you're ready to give.

I've said it, and I'm sure you've said it, too. "Just five more minutes." You hit the "snooze" button on your iPhone once (maybe twice? Show of hands?) and turn away from the window. So many kings of the Old Testament were steadfast in their sleepy ways, rejecting the light their God tried to share with them. Likewise, John tells us that, though Light — Christ — was sent into the world, the world preferred darkness.

Sometimes it seems, when reading through Scripture, that all throughout salvation history, God has been trying to pull back the curtains, to rouse us from our defiant slumber. And we resist Him. Time and time again, we resist Him.

Light brings a certain responsibility with it. It seems to compel productivity. Furthermore, there's no hiding in the light. Any photographer worth his salt knows how to manipulate it, highlighting the good and casting some merciful shade on the bad.

As we enter into the fourth week of Lent, we're getting so close to the main event. Can we handle the light that will come on Easter morning, bursting into the tomb as the stone is rolled away? Can we keep ourselves from hitting the "snooze" button on our souls, and sit up to face the dawn of a new day?

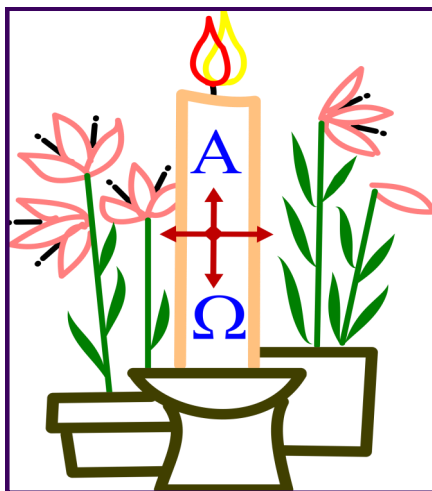

ST. JOSEPH

DIFFERENCES BETWEEN PRIESTS & BROTHERS

Question: What's the difference between priests and brothers, friars, etc.?

Answer: The distinctions titles and categories used for priests and the male members of religious communities can be confusing, especially since the categories can sometimes be intertwined as a man can be both a priest and a monk, or a brother and a friar. So, to help to piece the puzzle together, it's important to begin by noting some basic distinctions:

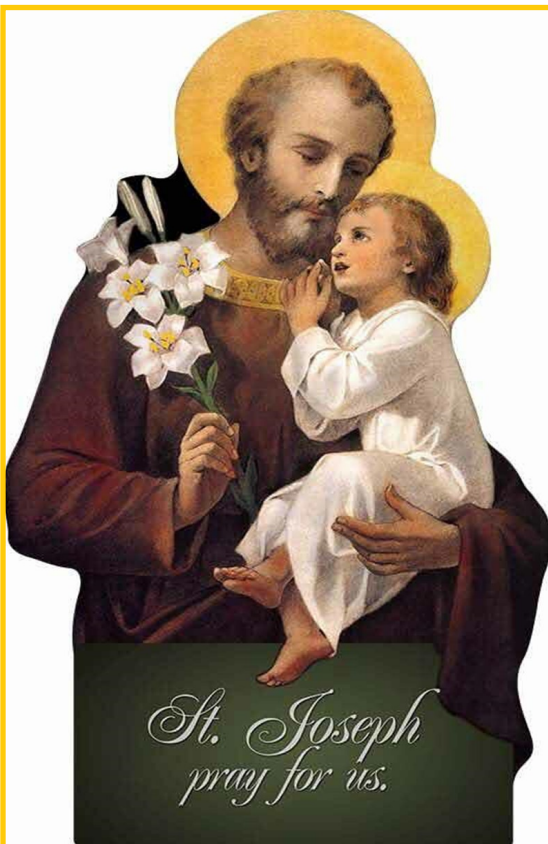
The distinction between priests (who are ordained for sacramental ministry) and brothers (who are non-ordained members of religious communities and who are committed to lives of prayer and service).

Priests: A priest is a man who has been ordained for sacramental ministry and these fall into two categories: A) Diocesan (or Secular) Priests can either be attached to a diocese and who serve under a bishop. Their ministry is usually oriented toward pastoral service. B) Religious Priests are members of religious communities (like the Franciscans, Jesuits, Salvatorians, or Carmelites) and their lives are guided by the special mission and charism of their community. While both kinds of priest practice sacramental ministry, their spirituality and how they live out their priesthood can be very different.

Brothers: Brothers are non-ordained members of religious communities (such as those mentioned above) who live lives committed to prayer and service. Religious priests and brothers serve together in their communities and their ministries include much more than the care of parishes.

Monks, Friars, and Canons: These are broad categories that include religious priests and brothers, and each of these is connected to specific ways of life and spiritualities.

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DIFERENCIAS ENTRE SACERDOTES y HERMANOS

Pregunta:Cuál es la diferencia entre sacerdotes y hermanos, Frailes, etc.?

Respuesta: Las distinciones títulos y categorías utilizados para los sacerdotes y los miembros masculinos de las comunidades religiosas pueden ser confusos, especialmente porque las categorías a veces pueden estar entrelazadas como un hombre puede ser tanto un sacerdote y un monje, o un hermano y un fraile. Por lo tanto, para ayudar a armar el rompecabezas, es importante comenzar señalando algunas distinciones básicas:

La distinción entre sacerdotes (que son ordenados para el Ministerio sacramental) y hermanos (que son miembros no ordenados de comunidades religiosas y que están comprometidos con vidas de oración y servicio).

Sacerdotes: un sacerdote es un hombre que ha sido ordenado para el Ministerio sacramental y estos caen en dos categorías: a) sacerdotes diocesanos (o seculares) pueden ser adjuntos a una diócesis y que sirven bajo un obispo. Su ministerio está generalmente orientado hacia el servicio pastoral. B) Los sacerdotes religiosos son miembros de comunidades religiosas (como los Franciscanos, Jesuitas, Salvatorianos o Carmelitas) y sus vidas son guiadas por la misión especial y el carisma de su comunidad. Mientras que ambos tipos de sacerdotes practican el Ministerio sacramental, su espiritualidad y cómo viven su sacerdocio pueden ser muy diferentes.

Hermanos: los hermanos son miembros no ordenados de comunidades religiosas (como las mencionadas anteriormente) que viven vidas comprometidas con la oración y el servicio. Los sacerdotes religiosos y los hermanos sirven juntos en sus comunidades y sus ministerios incluyen mucho más que el cuidado de las parroquias.

Monjes, Frailes y Canónigos: estas son categorías amplias que incluyen sacerdotes religiosos y hermanos, y cada uno de ellos está conectado a formas específicas de vida y espiritualidades.

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
