Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

April 2, 2023 Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

What's your car? Let's say it's a fancy silver Toyota. Now imagine you're having lunch in a restaurant and suddenly see two men outside attempting to steal it. You run outside and confront them. They respond, "The master has need of it." How do you respond? Would you just let them take it, and leave you without a car? I don't think I would.

Yet that is precisely what the owners of the colt on Palm Sunday do. Stunningly, and perhaps a little comically, Jesus instructs two of his disciples to commandeer a colt for him to ride. And when they hear the disciples say, "The master has need of it," they let them take it. Of course, Jesus knew they'd let it go. He gave them the grace to let go of what is rightfully theirs. The result? That colt became perhaps the most famous and important animal ever. The beast plays a role in the redemption of the world.

As Holy Week begins, Jesus perhaps will send people to you to ask for something valuable to you. Perhaps it's your car. More likely it's something like your attention, time, or energy. It's natural to resist at first. We've got things to do, after all. But if the interruption is from Jesus himself, listen to that voice which calmly says, "The master has need of it." And simply let it go. You'll be amazed what the master will do with it.

HOLY WEEK FASTING

My dearly beloved brothers and sisters, we thank God for this gift of witnessing another Holy week. In this Holy week, our Lord Jesus calls us to reflect on our lives and our relationship with our God and our neighbor. At the beginning of Lent, the Church proposes fasting, prayer and Almsgiving as ways to improve our relationship with God and with our neighbors. For our reflection in this Holy week, we are focusing on fasting.

What can we liken fasting to? In our today's economy many people like gold because it has great value in the marketplace. But as I reflect closely on gold, it dawned on me that gold is a type of stone that has been given great value. Nevertheless, for the value of this gold to shine forth, it needs to be refined, it needs to go through fire. The fire is not geared towards destroying the gold, rather it is geared towards removing the impurities that hinder the true value of the gold from shining out. This is what fasting does for us. Everyone of us has great value that has been given to us by God. This value is the gift of the Holy Spirit who lives in us and desires to shine out through us to the world in other to fill it with light; nevertheless, the impurities of our sins hinder that from happening. Hence, our Lord calls us to go deep into our hearts through fasting in order to make amends (Joel 2:13). He reveals to us the kind of fasting he desires when he says: "This ... is the fasting that I wish: releasing those bound unjustly, untying the thongs of the yoke, setting free the oppressed, breaking every yoke, sharing your bread with the hungry, sheltering the oppressed and homeless; clothing the naked when you see them, and not turning your back on your own. Do this, then your light shall break forth like the dawn." (Is.58:6-8).

To dispose ourselves for this true fasting, there is a need to fast or abstain from bodily pleasures be it those that in themselves are not sinful like food, drinks, material things, etc., or those which are sinful because their letting go helps us to grow in our relationship with God and our neighbor.

My dearly beloved in Christ, let us be willing to fast especially during this Holy Week, for through it, like gold, our true value shines out into the world for our good and the good of all we encounter.


