

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Preparations are in full gear for a number of young people from the diocese who are getting ready for this summer's World Youth Day. Originally planned for last summer (and pushed back because of Covid-19), this world gathering of youth with the Holy Father will be held in Lisbon, Portugal just over two months from now.

These meetings for the youth from around the world with the Holy Father began in 1984 during the papacy of St. John Paul II. Since then, they have grown exponentially, and well over a million young people are expected to be present for the Prayer Vigil and Concluding Mass celebrated by Pope Francis August 5-6.

I have personally attended several of these bi- or tri- yearly events, and as I have told many of you on several occasions, my vocation to the priesthood is a product of the first World Youth Day that I attended in Spain in August 1989. It was there that, as a twenty-eight year old, I first felt the Lord's calling to give my life, plans and projections over to Him. And He has surely not let me down! So many of the youth who attended that pilgrimage (and subsequent ones), met their future spouse and formed a Christian marriage, discerned a call to the religious life, or simply discovered the meaning of their lives and that happiness is found in serving, rather than in being served.

The results of a recent CDC survey of young people are very sobering: 59% of teenage girls and 44% of teenage boys in the U.S. claim to be "always sad." The temptation to conform is stronger than ever, and many find it hard to discover their true selves. As the Blessed Carlo Acutis (one of the patrons of the WYD, having himself died at the age of 15) held, "All are born as originals, but many die as photocopies." The sedentary life, and inability to take risks, is stealing the joy from so many of our youth.

So the fact that a number of young people from our diocese (220 in all) are willing to work hard, take part as a group in fund-raisers, cross the Atlantic and attend a large gathering trusting in Divine Providence as so many things could possibly go wrong for them, goes to show that some still believe in taking risks for Christ, knowing that those who find Him have found a pearl of the greatest worth. Their attitude is also in line with the theme of this year's World Youth Day, "Mary arose and went with haste," referring to her leaving Nazareth to visit Elizabeth (Lk 1:39).

Between now and August, a number of fund-raising events continue to be organized by the youth to assist with their traveling expenses. I encourage all people of good will to consider patronizing their upcoming events. I also encourage anyone whom these youth approach to listen to them as they recount the wonderful things that the Lord has already wrought in their lives, and ask them to bring your petitions with them to Portugal – a land blessed enough to have received Our Lady's message at Fatima. And consider helping them with a monetary donation if your means permit. You might seriously be investing in the future of the Church and our society at large!

I encourage all of us to participate in the World Youth Day celebrations to the extent that we can. You can visit the official site at: lisboa2023.org. Several other Catholic TV networks and social media outlets will give ample coverage to the different events, which underscore the fact that the Church remains young and vibrant. Hopefully, these young people may be able to share with us their experiences upon their return back home after the pilgrimage.


